- With his thick accent, it makes it more difficult to understand his ideas, especially with the complex lexicon of the algorithm language. But he can improvise by pronouncing words more clearly and not rush what he is saying so that people can follow along with him.
- More experience teaching. Stand aside from the white board so students can see what is being written.
